


Mission

The NC AHEC Program provides and supports educational activities and services with a focus on primary care in rural communities and those with less access to resources to recruit, train, and retain the workforce needed to create a healthy North Carolina.

With locations in Greenville and Elizabeth City, Eastern AHEC is one of nine centers in the NC AHEC Program and partners with ECU and other educational and health organizations to serve 23 counties in the eastern part of our state.



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- Provided 9,306 Nights of Housing across our region
 - Housing Locations (Ahoskie-2, Beaufort-2, Elizabeth City-1, Edenton-1, Goldsboro-2, Greenville-4, Jacksonville-3, New Bern-1)
- Provided Financial Support for Primary Care and Community Residency Training
 - ECUHMC Stipends--\$540,000 to support primary care residency stipends
 - ECU FM support--\$615,000 to support community resident experiences
 - ECU Psychiatry support -- \$57,000 to support residency training



- Supported Interprofessional education for students from different programs to learn from, with, and about each other's professions
 - Bus Tour of Greenville focusing on Social Determinants of Health
 - Interactive Reproductive Health education
 - Truist Interprofessional Leadership workshop
 - ECU's Institute for Healthcare Improvement Open School



- Offered over 1,400 Continuing Professional Development programs with just under 30,000 participants virtually, face-to-face or online.
 - Reached 1,727 nurses, 1,229 physicians, and 1,433 mental health providers
- Developed education using a range of learning modalities including:
 - Podcasts
 - Events including both patients AND providers learning with and from each other
 - Using standardized patients to help clinicians practice encounters with "patients"
 - Live in-person, Virtual, Hybrid, ECHO model, and learn at your own pace



- Focus Areas for Continuing Professional Development
 - Women's Health to improve perinatal and maternal outcomes
 - Mental and Behavioral Health especially around substance use and suicide
 - Continuing Medical Education as needed to improve care & build strong professional networks
- Our Practice Support Team provided "At the Elbow" help to practices improve care across eastern NC
 - In 2022-2023 they **communicated regularly with 217 practices** in the region with most of them **signed up** to participate in practice change including:
 - Clinical Workflow Operations
 - Collaborative Care Model (combining primary care with psychiatry support to improve access to mental health care)
 - Quality Improvement (Diabetes, Hypertension, Pre/Post Natal Care, Pediatric Immunizations)
 - Practice Needs Assessments
 - Practice Management Operations



NC AHEC Statewide Initiatives

- Focus on 3 Healthy NC 2030 priorities: Suicide, Drug Overdose, access to Primary Care
- Develop and deploy NC Center for Health Workforce
 - Collaboration between NC AHEC, DHHS, Dept of Commerce, Governor's office,& professional associations
 - Qualitative survey of employers needs
 - Using results, involve providers and statewide leaders to develop programs and plan
 - Data will be made available to colleges and universities to help fill the gaps.
 - NC Health Talent Alliance in development
- Develop and support a Community Health Worker certification program and continuing education

Recruit—2022-2023 Highlights

- Eastern NC Pathway Advisory Group made up of professionals across eastern NC who are committed to helping students enter health professions careers.
- Youth Health Service Corps, a program designed to introduce high school students to health careers and service learning, 104 students from 2 schools participated in 2022-2023.
- Hosted Northeast NC HOSA competition, with about 130 high schoolers participating and many of our staff judging and/or assisting



2023-2024—Recruit

- HOSA (Health Occupations Students of America) engagement
 - Hosted the **HOSA Leadership Conference** on October 3rd which comprises the local HOSA Chapter advisors and student officers, 60 participants attended this event.
 - Hosted the **Northeast HOSA Regional Leadership Conference** on November 7th with over 160 students.
 - Supported the **Southeast HOSA Regional Leadership Conference** by providing giveaways as well as providing financial support to bring the BSOM Mobile Sim Lab to the event.

 - Pathway programs and Housing
- NC Health Talent Alliance (collaboration between NC AHEC and NC Chamber)
 - Early phases of deploying Talent Pipeline Management across the state
 - "TPM provides employers and their education and workforce development partners with strategies and tools to co-design talent supply chains that connect learners and workers to jobs and career advancement opportunities"
- Exploring opportunities with STEM East, especially the STEM East Learning Ecosystem



2023-2024—Train

- AHEC Scholars—31 health professions students participated in the AHEC Scholars program this year, with 15 of them graduating from the 2-year program in April 2024
 - 4 Scholars funded by the ECU School of Dental Medicine
